## Rainforests

The New England region is spoilt for choice when it comes to stunning national parks. Some examples include;

- New England National Park
- Cathedral Rock National Park
- Guy Fawkes River National Park
- Oxley Wild rivers National Park
- Washpool National Park
- Werrikimbe National Park



By way of an example, New England National Park is a place of spectacular beauty and pristine wilderness.

The rainforests in New England National Park are part of the Gondwana Rainforests of Australia World Heritage Area; the most extensive strip of diverse rainforest anywhere on earth. The World Heritage Area is a direct window into the past and the future.

# Things to know:

- During our treks we get to view and photograph Antarctic beech forests as well as many other flora species, creeks and waterfalls.
- It's not just undisturbed flora that we will see. It is likely
  that we may view unique fauna as well, including a vast
  range of birds, such as rosellas, parrots, lyrebirds and
  bowerbirds, wallabies and various reptiles to name a
  few.

#### Waterfalls

There are a number of impressive waterfalls within the New England region.

Along with the major waterfalls in the district, there are many more falls that are not as well known. Some of these waterfalls cannot be accessed by vehicle and require trekking reasonable distance to reach them.

Our tours can include walks through magnificent rainforests that are home to unspoilt forests, rivers, creeks and beautiful waterfalls, just like the waterfall shown below.



## Things to know:

- We target areas that typically have low levels of tourist activity. Therefore, as photographers, we get to enjoy what we love doing without being distracted by others.
- A benefit of participating in workshops run by Phote-Scape is that we are able to take you to beautiful falls that are constantly running. Visitors can sometimes feel disappointed when the better known and more accessible waterfalls are not flowing at their peak often due to the nature of the region having four distinct seasons.

# **Rivers and the High Country**

There are a number of significant rivers that exist within the New England region.

For example, east flowing rivers include Gara, Nymboida and Styx. These rivers typically flow into the various headwaters and tributaries of the Clarence River, Hastings River and Macleay River.

West flowing rivers include the Gwydir, Namoi, McIntyre, Severn and MacDonald rivers. These rivers flow on to form part of the mighty Murray-Darling Basin.



The eastern rivers are usually faster flowing, and in many places follow deep gorges and form into some classic waterfalls. Many of the rivers start as creeks or small rivers within the national parks and rainforests that we visit.

Irrespective of the time of year, or the season, we can tap into photography opportunities that you will be proud to hang on your wall.

# Things to know:

- Gum boots or water proof footwear are recommended.
- Some locations will involve steep descent to rivers or creeks.
- If you have ND filters then some locations will offer good practice.
